



Fannie Sue Worley-Perry

Fannie Sue Perry, affectionately known as Sue by her family, passed away peacefully on December 10, 2024, at the age of 92. Born on October 10, 1932, in Robeson County, NC, she was the beloved daughter of the late Ola Fannie Oliver Worley and Hardy Frank Worley.

Sue graduated from West Side High School, in Chadbourn, NC, and went on to earn both a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Elementary Education and Business Administration from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University in Greensboro. She was a proud and loyal alumna, achieving the distinction of a Golden Aggie after more than 70 years of dedicated membership in the Aggie Family.

A woman of deep faith, Sue was a cornerstone of Mt. Zion United Methodist Church, where she was an active member for over 50 years. She expressed her devotion through service-singing in the choir, teaching Vacation Bible School and preparing meals as part of the food committee. Her contributions to the church reflected her kind and giving spirit.

Sue's passion for service extended to her community. She was a long-time member of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc., where she uplifted women and families through education and empowerment initiatives. She was also a proud member of the Ravishing E&G Red Hatters, finding joy in fellowship

and friendship. Additionally, Sue lent her time and talents to her local community center, always willing to help others in need.

In 1964, Sue married her soulmate, Charles Stancil Perry, and they relocated to Baltimore, MD in 1966. Through Charles preceded her death in 1974, their enduring love remained a cherished part of her life. Sue did not have children of her own but was a devoted educator for more than 40 years, shaping the lives of elementary school students in Baltimore and briefly, in Columbus County, NC and Saginaw, MI. Her classroom was a place of encouragement and inspiration, reflecting her deep love for children.

An avid bowler, Sue enjoyed competing in leagues and honing her skills on the lanes. Her adventurous spirit also led her to travel the world-visiting Africa, Paris, Turkey and many other destinations. Summers were often spent cruising the seas, indulging her love for exploration and making lasting memories.

Sue's legacy is one of faith, service and love. She leaves behind a profound impact on her family, friends, students and all who were fortunate enough to know her.

Sue is survived by her loving sisters, Barbara Frink of Baltimore, MD and Iris Gilchrist of Durham, NC, as well as a host of nieces, nephews and dear friends who will forever cherish her memory.
