Faye Kimberly Pryor, the middle of three, was born on March 24, 1960, in Richmond, Virginia, to the late Linwood Henry Pryor and Amanda Anderson Pryor. At an early age, she accepted Christ and joined First Union Baptist Church in Mechanicsville, under the pastorate of the late Reverend Dr. B. S. Giles, Sr.

On February 4, 2026, she peacefully earned her heavenly wings after a brief illness, leaving behind a legacy of faith, music, and service. She was preceded in death by her beloved sister, Carole Marie Pryor Starcher.

Faye remained a devoted and active member of First Union Baptist Church throughout her life. Her love for the church was evident in both her presence and her praise. Gifted with a beautiful musical talent, Faye faithfully served for more than 40 years as a member of the B.S. Giles Memorial Choir and the Voices of Inspiration Choir. She also shared her passion for music by leading the First Union Baptist Church Youth Choir, encouraging and inspiring young voices. Beyond music, Faye served her church in many capacities, including as an usher, children's church coordinator, and member of the history ministry. Her commitment to ministry extended beyond her home church through years of involvement with the Chickahominy Baptist Association. She was also a dedicated member of the Gospel Music Workshop of America, Richmond Chapter, for over 30 years, traveling across the country, forming lifelong

friendships, and continually using her voice to glorify God.

Faye received her education through Hanover County Public Schools and graduated from Lee-Davis High School in 1978. She continued her studies at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College before earning a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Virginia Union University. Professionally, she worked a long career with Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield, where she served as an Imaging Specialist.

While her accomplishments were many, Faye's greatest work was the care she gave to others. She possessed a true servant's heart and was known for her willingness to help those in need. Whether caring for aging relatives, supporting friends, or lovingly watching over children at a moment's notice, Faye gave her time and energy freely. Her servitude and nurturing spirit touched countless lives.

Faye leaves to cherish her memory her loving brother, Linwood Bradley Pryor (Brandy); brother-in-law, James Starcher; niece and nephew, Tristan Starcher and Savera Starcher; nieces and nephews, Brooke Johnson, Beoncia Johnson Brown, Matthew Johnson, and Chance Johnson.
