Florence E. Jackson, daughter of the late Herman J. and Lena Harris, was born July 26, 1918 in Baltimore, Maryland. She entered into eternal life on Monday, October 11, 2004. She was educated in the Baltimore in the Baltimore City Public School System. At the age of fifteen Florence accepted Christ as her personal Savior and joined the Mount Sinai Baptist Church where Rev. Taylor was pastor. During World War II, Florence was employed at Glen L. Martin Defense Plant. In 1949 she met and married the late George Jackson. During this marriage she and her husband were the owners and managers of three variety stores. The last store known as Jackson's Variety, upon the sale of both business and home, Florence retired, moving her residency to the newly built Belvedere Greens Senior Citizen Complex. Florence was very active throughout her stay in her building. She loved working in the Dining Hall and Thrift Center Shop. She found a great deal of joy in fellowshiping with the other residents and helping out in any capacity she was needed. In January of 1969 Florence became a member of the little Ark Missionary Baptist Church under the pastoral leadership of the late Rev. Matthews Marcus Sr. She was a faithful member of the Pastor's Aide and Senior Usher Ministry often known by her trademark starched white uniform. Florence loved her pastor Rev. J.L. Carter, and her church family. She served the Ark Church faithfully until her health failed. Florence was blessed with a warm, friendly spirit.
