FLOSSIE LEE COZART PRICE, daughter of the late William and Gracie Cozart, was born June 15, 1929 in Granville County, North Carolina. She was called to her heavenly home on Sunday, October 30, 2005 after a lengthy illness at the Lorien Frankford Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Baltimore, Maryland. She accepted Christ at an early age and became a member of Union Chapel Baptist Church in Butner, North Carolina. Flossie graduated from G.C. Hawley High School in Creedmoor, N.C. May 1947. Upon completing high school she provided child care until deciding to relocate to Baltimore, Maryland where she met and later married the late Jessie Mac Price. The two were married for forty-six years. They later joined Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church, God blessed this union with one son. Thereafter she attended Dunbar High School and graduated as a seamstress. She spent many days and nights year after year pouring her heart into the work of seamstry, which she enjoyed so very much. Flossie also loved baking, talking to friends and family on the phone, children, family gatherings, gardening, preserving homegrown fruits and vegetables. She was a fun person to be around and always had a way of making you laugh. Flossie was a dedicated home care provider for a very loving family over a thirty-year period until the time of her retirement. Shortly afterwards Flossie and her late husband moved to Littleton, N.C. where she became a member of Lee's Chapel Baptist Church. Flossie resided there in Littleton until the death of her husband. Due to Flossie's failing health she moved back to Baltimore, Maryland where she

resided with her devoted sister and brother-in-law who provided optimum care along with the care of other sisters and brothers until Flossie's health deteriorated to the point whereas professional care was required.
