April 4, 1966 - November 10, 2001

He became a Christian at a very early age, attending both the Jones Tabernacle Church and the Wilson Chapel Baptist Church. He loved to go to church and was a member of the church choir. Fowan graduated with Honors from Lake Clifton Senior High School after which he proceeded to attend the Peabody Preparatory Institute and was a Music Major, specialized in Classical music. Fowan's first recital at Peabody occurred January 23, 1986, he played a selection by Dionisio Aquada, also while attending classes at Peabody, Fowan enrolled at the Morgan State University majoring in Music. He was such an outstanding student, dazzling his music professors through correcting mistakes that they made. Fowan played an important part as a standing member of the Morgan's Marching Band, as well as the lead guitar player in the Jazz ensemble. His peers honored Fowan as a notable student. Fowan was employed as a Special Security Agent with Heritage Security based at the Social Security Administration in Woodlawn. At the time of his death, Fowan was preparing to

make a transition to become a Deputy Sheriff at the Aberdeen Proving Ground. To add to his many accomplishments Fowan was a featured model for Ms. Willa Bland of Flair Studios.
