She was also was an excellent cook. You could always go to her house for a home cooked meal. Chitterlings, pig feet, potato salad, collard greens and a slice of homemade pound cake. You could smell the food as soon as you got to the gate. She would often call and say come on over and bring a pot and she would fill it with whatever delicious creation she cooked that day.
