Mason and Ralph and two sisters, Alberta and Gladys . Frances is survived by her devoted nephew, James Archer; two nieces, Arsonia Rogers and Veronica Grandy; one nephew, George DePriest, Jr.; three great-nieces, Kristen Cotman (Arthur), Ebony Phillips and Arsonia Grandy; one great-great niece, Destiney Brown and two great-great nephews, Jordan and Justin Cotman. Frances also leaves to cherish her memory a devoted friend, Alease Christian.

Frances grew up in New Kent County and joined Ebenezer Baptist Church at an early age. She was the first female black Postmaster in Walker, VA. She retained the Postmaster position for several years. She was a devoted Christian and she took her civic duties seriously. Frances devoted her time to helping people in the county by taking family, friends and church members on errands who didn't have transportation. Frances was the chairman of the missionary board at Ebenezer for several years. She was a youth Sunday school teacher and occasionally played the piano for the choir.

Frances loved helping others and her faith spoke for itself. She walked by faith

and not by sight. Her loving spirit was contagious and she will truly be missed.
