Frances received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System. She attended Samuel Coleridge-Taylor Elementary School #122. She then attended Booker T. Washington Junior High School. She received her High school Diploma from Douglass High School (1957) specializing in the Business Education Curriculum, continuing her education at Calvert Adult Education Center in which she completed a two year certificate of award as the first student in the history of Howard Educational Center day program to complete Bookkeeping 11 (1969). In 1969, Frances accepted a position at Equitable Bank as a Central File Clerk. Later promoted to a Processing Clerk

and then to a Reconciliation Clerk, until she retired 1990. After Frances retirement, her passion for collecting and recycling vintage items led to her current position at Patapsco Flea Market as a Cashier. Frances was dedicated to the Flea Market, it was more than just a job, for her it was also a place where young children looked forward to their "smiley faces." Frances is survived by William S. Wilson; one son, Albert Davis, Jr.; two daughters, Sharon Wilson-Harden and Denise Wilson-Mabry' two sons-in-law, Prezel M. 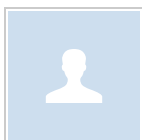
