Life Story of Francine

Francine Paulette White was born December 20, 1948, the eldest child of the late Elizabeth (Watkins) Williams and Alonza E. Williams, Sr. She departed this life on Sunday, February 4, 2017 after a long illness.

She grew up in Baltimore City and attended Baltimore City Public Schools. After graduating from Forest Park High School, Francine took classes at what was then known as the Community College of Baltimore, today known as Baltimore City Community College. It was her desire to enter the nursing profession. She also, during this time, volunteered as a Candy Stripper at Sinai Hospital. She was such a caring and generous person that it was no surprise Francine would want to pursue a career in nursing.

Francine was employed by the Social Security Administration and she later worked for Baltimore City Department of Human Resources for many years from which she subsequently retired.

Francine was a life-long member of Rehoboth Church of God in Christ Jesus (Apostolic). At an early age she was water baptized and received the Holy Ghost and remained an active member all her life. She not only grew up under the pastoral guidance of the late Bishop Randolph A. Carr, but because of her

friendship with the Bishop's sister-in-law, Ilice Weston, she accompanied Bishop Carr and his family on a trip to his home in the West Indies. Her dedication to Christian service was tapped by her aunt, Evangelist Catherine N. Woods, who as General Secretary for the Churches of God in Christ Jesus Apostolic, Inc., enlisted her assistance for the Annual International Convocation. Francine became a fixture in the office handling a variety of duties with a peaceful, sweet spirit that made her work seem so easy. For Rehoboth Church, Francine acted as a church secretary responsible for church announcements.

In 1970, Francine married Norenzer White, and from their union three beautiful daughters, Cassandra, Lisa, and Tashara were born. Francine loved family, and, later in life, her grandchildren were the center of her life. She cherished each of them, and those feelings were returned. Francine was family matriarch and no gathering was complete without her.

Like many young homemakers of the time, Francine learned to sew and she enjoyed knitting. She made her clothes and those for her young daughters. Each of her daughters personally embodies one of their mother's attributes, Cassandra is married with children; Lisa works in the medical profession; and Tashara designs clothes.

In later years, Francine became very comfortable using technology. Once she created a Facebook account, she was hooked. She sent inspirational and encouraging messages to her Facebook friends, and was an avid gamer. There are fond memories of her singing and playing hymns on the record player. Most of all we will always remember that infectious "Francine smile." She is preceded in death by her sister JoAnn Broome and loving aunt Isabell Lee.

Francine departed from her earthly tabernacle on Saturday, February 4, 2018. She leaves to cherish her memory her three daughters; Cassandra Williams (Kenneth); Lisa and Tashara White. Four grandchildren, Adria, Joshua, Justin, and Jordan Redmond. Two brothers: Alonza, Jr. and Michael Williams; two sisters, Miriam and Mary, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, special
