FRANK WILLIAM JOHNSON, son of the late Robert James and Charlottie Johnson, was born on April 25, 1915, in Tarboro, Edgecombe County, North Carolina. He departed this life on October 16, 2013 at Veteran 's Hospital.

Frank received his education in the public school system of North Carolina. He moved to Baltimore, Maryland, in 1941, and in 1942 married Annis Mae Gorham, also from Tarboro, NC. From this union one son, Frank "Ford" Johnson, was born.

Frank served in the U.S. Army during World War II from 1942-1945. he received numerous decorations and good conduct medals for tours of duty in Germany, Naples, Rome, and northern Africa . After returning from the war, frank worked on the waterfront in Baltimore until gaining employment at Bethlehem Steel in 1948 where he worked for 30 years up to retirement in 1978.

for over 30 years, Frank enjoyed retirement by frequently going to quartet programs. He was an active member of the Waxter Senior Center where he loved playing checkers and entertaining friends. In 2001, he joined Enon Baptist Church and served as a faithful member. He also loved his cars and playing cards, particularly Solitaire. Frank is especially remembered for his candid humor, many stories and tall tales.

Loved and missed, he leaves to cherish their precious memories: one son, Frank L. Johnson, Sr.; a daughter-in-law, Junetta Johnson; one brother, Coy L.
