Frank McKinley Williams was called home on Wednesday, May 3, 2017. He was born on July 22, 1922 in South Boston to the late Willie Williams and Rebecca Jones Williams. He moved from South Boston to Pittsburgh, PA in 1938 and later moved to Richmond and graduated from Maggie Walker High School. He served in the 24th Infantry U.S. Army, World War II from 1943 to 1946 and was self-employed as a barber for many years. He was also a member of the MOCHA Shriners in Richmond.

Frank joined Hood Temple African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church on March 23, 1947, after leaving First Baptist Church, South Boston, Virginia. Upon his arrival at Hood Temple, Frank never slowed down. He was a vital part of the Christian Education Department and served as Sunday School Superintendent for over 18 years, past member of the Varick Brotherhood, Lay Council, Class Leader, Life Member of the Women's Home and Overseas Missionary Society, Stewart Board, Trustee Board, Emeritus, Class #6 and the Hood Temple Male Chorus for over 50 years, which he loved with a passion. He served God and always walked the path that a Christian should travel. Frank was preceded in death by his first wife, Cleo Williams and his daughter, Gladys Williams Carter. He leaves to cherish his memory, his loving and devoted wife, Doris M. Williams; three children, "Cee Cee" Johnson, Frank Williams Jr., and Theresa D. Jones (Lawrence).
