FRANKIE HARRIS COLE, son of the late Reuben Cole and Ada Harris Cole was born on April 22, 1946. He was raised by his grandparents; the late Daniel Monroe and the late Pauline Monroe. "Frank" as he was known, attended the Baltimore City Public School System. He departed this life on Tuesday, June 22, 2010 after a lengthy illness.

Since childhood, Frank had a great love of cars. He collected an assortment of automotive magazines and fancied himself an amateur design engineer. Frank was a caring, thoughtful and loving man. Whenever you saw him, you could always count on receiving a wide warm welcoming smile. No matter how he felt, he was always more concerned about others. He was patient, he had a great sense of humor and an enormous heart for helping people. He loved to work and always placed the needs of his family above his own.

In 1966 Frank went into the United States Army for a two year tour of duty. During his time in the United States Army, he was a Military Police Officer. In 1977 he was employed by the Baltimore City Department of Public Works where he remained for twenty-five years until he retired. In 1989, he married Denise Wyche and together they raised her son, Glenn Dezurn, Jr. along with her daughter, LaKisha Paul. The thirteen and a half years of marriage ended in divorce. However, the friendship and loving family remained.

A few months into retirement, Frank went back to work, accepting a position with the Baltimore City Register of Wills where he remained for a year and a

half. For three years, thereafter, he worked as a Security Guard at the Convention Center in downtown Baltimore, Maryland. In 2006, he was employed with Johns Hopkins Hospital. He resigned when his health began to fail.

He leaves to cherish his memory: mother, Ada Harris Cole; former wife, Denise Cole; stepdaughter, LaKisha Paul; stepson, Glenn Dezurn, Jr.; grandson, Robert William Jr.; Nicole Cole and Melanie Cole, whom he loved as if they were his daughters; special friend, Jeanette Green; best friend, Harold Lyles and a host of other relatives and friends.
