Rev. Fred Archie Hannah, beloved husband, father, grandfather and pastor was born February 25, 1933 in Lake City, South Carolina to the late Deacon John and Rebecca Hannah. He was educated in the Lake City Public School System. At an early age, he accepted Christ as his personal savior. He attended Netties Temple Church, founded and pastored by his aunt. For 50 years, he was married to the former Lottie Hardy of King William, Virginia. In 1953, he moved to Richmond, Virginia and joined the Cedar Street Memorial Baptist Church of God. He served on the Usher Board, taught Sunday School and was ordained as a Deacon in 1977. While serving as a Deacon, he received and answered his calling to the ministry. In October 1977, he preached his initial trial sermon and was licensed to preach. He was ordained to the Gospel Ministry by Rev. Dr. Benjamin Robertson, Cedar Street Memorial Baptist Church of God in 1980. He was employed with Overnite Transportation as a long distance truck driver until he retired. In 1978, he received his Certificate of Completion from the School of Theology at Virginia Union University. His ministry took him to many places throughout the North and South. Rev. Hannah was active in ministering to individuals in the State Penal Institutions and Senior Retirement and Nursing Facilities. Rev. Hannah was the founder of Blessed Hope Baptist Church, which was established in his home on January 13, 1980. Rev. Hannah was a warm, loving and giving individual who well liked and admired by all who knew him. Surviving and mourning his loss is his devoted wife, Lottie A. Hannah, two

sons, Ronald(Clarrusha), Richmond, Virginia; Truman, South, Carolina; one brother, David Hannah, Lake City, South Carolina; two sisters; Nancy Robinson, Lake City, South Carolina and Geraldine Timmons, Syracuse, NY; a devoted sister-in-law Minnie A. Miller; four brothers-in-law; four grandchildren, four great grand children, a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.
