He was called to Eternal Rest and Peace on Wednesday, August 3, 2005 at his residence following an extended illness. Fred attended the public schools of Halifax County. At an early age he joined Cedar Creek Baptist Church in Scotland Neck, North Carolina. He served his country in the United States Marines from 1952 to 1954 when he was honorably discharged. He relocated to Baltimore, Maryland and married the late Clementine Pittman Archer and they shared over fifty-three years together. He was owner/operator of Archer's Grocery Store for many years and later he was employed at Lacy's Iron Foundry until he retired. He was a faithful member of the Whitestone Baptist Church where he served on the Usher Board. Three brothers, Herbert Hoover, Charlie Mack and James Roland Archer preceded him in death.
