This is my father’s testimony as to how far he had come in his lifetime. My father, Fred Nelson Montree, also known as “Hounddog”, was a strong, disciplined, independent and routine person. At 96, he had a weekly schedule of going to the barbershop on Tuesday and on Friday: grocery shopping, doing laundry paying his bills and banking his money. His diet consisted mainly of foods high in fiber. He also enjoyed sweets and daily exercise. He watched channel 13 from the time he got up until the time he went to bed. Freddie read the newspaper daily and could express his opinion on local and worldwide events. He prayed over most things, including glasses of water and he had blessing for everyone.

One of his proudest accomplishments was that he was a life-time member of the NAACP. If you knew Freddie, you will remember him saying one of the following in jest and with a smile:

“Ain’t nothing shaking but the leaves on the tree”

“Make that money, honey”

“My kind of people”

“Don’t talk loud, you’ll draw a crowd”, and his infamous

“Always a pleasure”

My Dad leaves no one to mourn him as this is time for rejoicing. He was a variable tree planted in the line of his decedents and we all come to honor him as it was his time. To know him was to Love him.
