Deacon Freddie L. Hall,Sr.,son of the late Cyrus and Louise Hall,was born in Henrico County on July 22,1921. He departed this life on January 5,2011 after a brief illness.

Deacon Hall was educated in the Henrico County Public Schools. After graduating from Virginia Randolph High School,he joined the St. James Baptist Church on July 7,1938,under the leadership of Reverend O.B. Simms. He was ordained as a deacon on November 3,1958 and became a member of the Deacons' Conference of Richmond,Virginia.
