The journey of life for Brother Frederick Berkeley Fox, known affectionately as "Freddie" sweetly ended on Friday, August 6, 2010, as he transitioned from labor to reward. Born March 21, 1950 to the late Aubrey D. and Lula Mae (Oliver) Fox of Glen Allen, Virginia. He was proud to be of a family of nine children.

He attended Virginia Randolph High School where he fostered lifelong friendships. He went on to attend Merritt College in Oakland, CA. and the University of Cal/Berkeley. He later returned to Richmond and began a career with C&O Transportation where through a series of promotions and extensive training he became a Locomotive Engineer. He serviced areas from Newport News, Va., Florence, SC., and Jacksonville, FL. He received several performance awards from youth through retirement including "Outstanding Young Men of America" in 1985; FRA Certification in 1999; Service Goal Award in 2001 & 2002; and Safety Award in 2002 to name a few.

At a very early age, Frederick Fox accepted Christ as his Savior and was baptized and became a member of Mount Olive Baptist Church, Glen Allen, VA. He often spoke of unforgettable encounters he had with the Lord during his youth. Later in his adult life he joined North Gayton Baptist Church, Short Pump. There he sought to be involved as much as possible even though his work schedule kept him away due to extensive travel. There he was ordained as a Deacon, January 21, 1996. He later awarded a Certificate of Completion, April 30, 2000 for additional training for the office of Deacon. God continued to move in his life and he often spoke of Trinity Baptist Church and a special desire to visit. For over a year between travel and work he often visit. He made a decision to join and he completed his three-month series of new member classes July 11, 2004. He had an earnest desire for the study of God's Word and became involved in Adult Sunday School and the Men's Ministry. He would often attend both 8AM and 10:55AM Sunday morning services when his health permitted.

In anticipation for retirement, he and his wife opened a Bed & Breakfast, Magnolia Manor, in 2000. Through his support and guidance they added a second location on Brook Road at Virginia Center Commons, where they provided event planning and event decor services. He wore many hats, including, administrator, server, delivery, or whatever was necessary to get the job done. All was done with a big smile and a hearty laugh. You could always depend on "Freddie".
