Upon completion of his education, Fulton's parents wanted him to become a minister, so he studied the bible and took classes. Fulton always had a passive, loving way. He was a gentle giant. He was employed at Montgomery Ward and Company as a truck driver. He met the love of his life, Rose Miller, and they married in 1942. Through this union there were no children. They traveled and the both enjoyed the finer things in life. As a result of this union, there was a lifetime bond that Fulton had with his mother-in-law, Clara Brent. He helped take care of her until her death in 1993. His wife, Rose passed away forty years ago. Fulton was drafted into the U.S Army where he served in World War II. He served as a duty soldier and truck driver with the 3528th Quartermaster Truck Company in Kyoto, Japan and was also a squad leader who served under General McArthur and General Patton. He retired from Ft. Meade. Fulton was a kind-hearted, peaceful man, devoted to family and friends. He was a dearly loved man.
