GARY LAMONT BURKE, was born on October 4, 1955 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late William Albert and Gwendolyn Irene Burke. God called Gary home on November 19, 2020, following a five-year battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Growing up, the Burke household was filled with love, laughter and great food. The family attended St. Edward Roman Catholic Church where Gary was baptized and served as an altar boy. His parents also instilled in him the value of a great education. He attended and graduated from Loyola Blakefield. Gary's love of sports and athletic ability were the driving force to his acceptance on Loyola's football and basketball teams.

After graduating high school in 1973, Gary attended Babson College in Wellesley, Massachusetts where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting. There he served as the president of the Black Society, manager of the student dining hall and resident assistant of his dormitory. This was the precursor to leadership positions Gary would hold throughout his professional career.

Coopers & Lybrand (now Pricewaterhouse Coopers) hired Gary as a Sr. Auditor following his graduation from Babson in 1977. Gary excelled in accounting becoming a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and member of the National Association of Black Accountants (NABA) where he served as president of the Baltimore chapter from 1985-86.

In August 1981, Gary's first son, Brandon, was born with then wife Chris (Stokes) Cephas. Soon after, two more sons, Christopher and Jonathan, followed. During this time, Gary transitioned from public accounting to working in commercial real estate at the Rouse Company.

In September 1989, Gary welcomed his first daughter, Amanda, with then wife Nina (Abbott) Burke, followed by second daughter, Rachel. During this time, Gary added golf to his list of sports and became an avid player.

After switching industries yet again in the late 1980s to work at USF&G, Gary joined the Fidelity & Guaranty (F&G) Life Company in 1993 where he served as Senior Vice President. It was at F&G Life where Gary became a titan in the life insurance industry. He negotiated numerous opportunities and mergers for the company as one of only a handful of African American SVPs in the industry. He was a true pioneer.

Throughout the remainder of his career, Gary held leadership roles at many other organizations, culminating as President of The Union Labor Life Insurance Company (ULLICO).

On June 30, 2007, Gary married Dr. Kim Bondurant and welcomed two "bonus" daughters, Christiana and Jasmine. The family eventually settled in Bowie, MD where he lived until his passing. Both being avid sports fans, Gary and Kim enjoyed watching college and professional football while enjoying Kim's homemade chili and desserts.

Family was always important to Gary and wherever he worked, his colleagues knew about his children. He took them on business trips and was always sure to impart his knowledge to them. He taught them the value of education, giving back and love, while never missing an opportunity to outwardly express his love to them.

In 2015, Gary was diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's Disease. Although the disease meant that he could no longer work, he did not let that stop him from being an influential leader. He still volunteered his time and knowledge to his community and became an avid walker to maintain his health.

Gary leaves to celebrate his memory: his loving wife Kim; sons Brandon, Christopher (Tygerian), Jonathan; daughters Amanda Packard (Sara), Rachel D'Huyvetter (Chas); step-daughters Christiana Hilton and Jasmine Hilton; five grandchildren Skyler, Mason, Otis, Isaac and Carly; three sisters, Jacqueline Gundy, Sharon Thames and Kathy Burke; one brother, William ("Skip"); six brothers-in-law, Steven Thames, Sr., Ronald Bondurant, Jr., Timmy Bondurant, Tommy Bondurant, Terry Bondurant and Nimon Bondurant; one sister-in-law, Ansonia Anderson; many nieces and nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends.
