However, he always made it known that Von was his best friend. Whenever she was out of the house and he had no idea of where she was, he would call everyone asking "have you seen Von" until he found her. He was always a true friend and devoted family man. His nieces and nephews loved him and were always glad to see Uncle Curley. In 1980, Curley and Yvonne gave their life to Christ at the Living Word Christian Center. They both later joined the Way of Eternal Life under the teachings of Bro. Mike Thomas. Curley's love for the Lord was

real and genuine. He had no problem sharing his belief and love for God.
