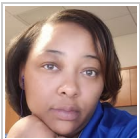

He was funny and silly and showed us that men could be invested in the children of the family too. There was no doubt he was a great dad and grandfather but he also spent time with his nephews, taking them fishing and talking with them about the things that young men need to talk about when their father is not around. He was a good friend. He was patient. He was full of surprises including writing a most welcomed letter to a homesick niece away at school. With Uncle Paul you knew you were safe. Not just because most of his life he was muscular, working out daily and trained dogs but because he could with a silly joke lighten a heavy mood. He was genuine and easy going, and he was a man that didn't need to be the center of attention to be seen and heard. My uncle was not ashamed to say that he had made some mistakes in his youth. Our family was lucky to have had him for the time we did. He guided two great-nephews in his home for a time, raised a son and was admired by all including a host of in-laws, nieces and nephews.
