October 10, 1941 - September 1, 2025

Bishop George William Brown was born on October 10, 1941, in Farmville, Virginia, to the late Patrick Roosevelt Brown and Marthia Washington Tyler. On September 1, 2025, he answered his heavenly call and entered the gates of glory.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Bishop Woodson Washington Jr., and Ella L. Washington, and his son, Blaine Tyler.

Bishop Brown was educated in the Richmond Public School System and graduated from Armstrong High School. At an early age, he accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior. In 1975, he was ordained as a pastor and later served faithfully as Bishop of The Holy Bible Church of God on Dill Avenue in Richmond, Virginia.

On October 11, 1960, he married the love of his life, Silveriva Johnson, in Farmville, Virginia. Together they built a life filled with faith, family, and love.

Bishop Brown was formerly employed by Southern Railway as a Foreman

Supervisor, where he made history as the first African American to serve in that position.

In his leisure, he enjoyed fishing, trains, and good food. He often referred to himself as a chef, delighting in preparing meals for his family. Above all, he cherished sharing time with loved ones.

He will be remembered as a kind and giving man who was deeply spiritual. He never missed an opportunity to tell others about the Lord and often encouraged everyone to keep their hearts free from anger.

Bishop Brown leaves to cherish his memory his beloved wife, Silveriva Brown; children, Tracie Ella Harrington, Petula Ann Armstead, Georgette Renee Ford, Sean Tyler, Dane Tyler, and Letitia Royster (Linwood); a host of grandchildren and great-grandchildren; along with many other relatives, church family, and dear friends.

His legacy of faith, love, and kindness will live on in the hearts of all who knew him.
