George Davis, Sr., son of the late James and Evelina Davis, was born in Charleston South Carolina on March 31, 1934. He departed this life quietly on Monday, November 17, 2014 at 6:20 a.m., surrounded by his family at home.

George attended Jamestown High School in Jamestown South Carolina.

George and his siblings were raised in a Christian home and fellowshipped with Charity Baptist Church in Charleston. When his father moved the family to Honey Hill, they joined Wesley AME Church, where he was an avid Sunday school student under his Class Leader, Deacon Harold Padgett and pastoral leadership of Reverend Butler. At the age of thirteen, during a revival at the Jehovah Holiness Church, that night, George accepted the call of Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior, was baptized and received the Gift of the Holy Spirit with evidence of speaking in other tongue. He and his siblings would often tell the stories of how they would experience the move of God by dancing and worshipping God in the Spirit.

George migrated his family to Baltimore in the early 60's after working for his cousin William Davis and Aussie McConnell Logging Company in Shulerville. George loved the Lord and would always be found sitting at the kitchen table reading his bible. Falling asleep only to wake up and start over again. He was an active member of First Apostolic Faith Church under the pastoral leadership of HIS Bishop Cornelious Showell. There he served diligently on the Senior Usher Board until his health slowed him down. When he was not able to attend church, he would listen to his Bishop's teaching on the radio every Saturday evening.

Uncle George and Aunt Gail, as they were so affectionately called, were loved by their nieces, nephews, great nieces and nephews, family and friends, for their fatherly and motherly affections toward them. On any given day of the week or time of the day, they would be able to stop pass the house or call from near and far to talk and laugh with them. Of course, you would be asked if you wanted anything to eat, because what a cook he was. Par Excellent!!! The family favorites were Mac and Cheese, Okra and Tomatoes, Butter and Lima Beans and Spaghetti. There was even the community resident who were friends of the boys who would stop over for a meal. No Questions Asked!!! He was beloved in his community for his willingness to serve them in gardening, decoration home repair and transportation.

Boy oh Boy did he Love his Brothers and Sisters. For him, to be in their presence was like being a kid again. If there was any family gathering in Baltimore, Shulerville, Philadelphia or New York, he would be there to brighten up all with his Great Big Smile!!
