MR. GEORGE JULIAN BROWN, the oldest of eight children born to the late George and Ira B. Brown, was born in Worth County, Georgia on August 31, 1927. His rich life came to a close on Friday, May 30, 2003. He was educated in the Worth County School System and later attended Morgan State College. In 1950, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, where he served his country during the Korean Conflict and received an honorable discharge. George retired from the U.S. Postal Service. He was married to Gladys Moon Brown, who preceded him in death in 1994. At an early age, George joined the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in Shingler, Georgia. In later years, George relocated to Baltimore, Maryland and joined the Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church, where he served faithfully until his death.
