Georgett Jordan, the oldest of five siblings, was the daughter of the late Kenneth and Izona Vines. Born May 10, 1921 in Isle of Wight County, Virginia, Georgett transitioned to her heavenly home on Friday, August 28, 2020.

Georgett attended school in Virginia. She later moved to Baltimore, Maryland and married the late George Washington Jordan, Sr. on May 24, 1940. From that union a son, George Washington Jordan, Jr., affectionately called June, was born.

Georgett accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her Savior and became a member of the United Baptist Church under Rev. George E. Vanderford.

Georgett was employed by the State of Maryland in the Dietary Department of Springfield Hospital, from which she retired. After retirement, she worked for a short time at the corner store on Greenmount Avenue.
