Georgia Mary Ross Cox was born on December 12, 1941 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Pensacola Johnson Ross and the late William Chambers. She departed this life on November 16, 2020. "G George", as she was affectionately called, was the 10th born of Pensacola's twelve children and last of twelve to be called home to glory. 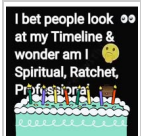
