GEORGIA “MAMA” HAMLIN, was born on March 2, 1916 to Emmitt “Big Daddy” and Marie “Big Mama” Grandison in Isle of Wright County, Smithfield, Virginia. On March 8, 2013, she closed her eyes and quietly went home to be with her Savior.

On November 17, 1934, Georgia married Robert Hamlin, also of Isle of Wright County, Smithfield, Virginia. To this union Joyce Ann Black and Robert Hamlin were born.

Georgia attended grade school in Isle of Wright County, Smithfield, Virginia. She accepted Christ at an early age and attended Hill Street Baptist Church where she was baptized.

In 1937, she moved to Baltimore City, Maryland permanently. After relocating, she attended Friendship Baptist Church before finding her home church, Christian Community Church of God. She loved to sing on the choir. She attended services there regularly until her health began to fail. Joyce dedicated her life to nurturing and caring for her.

Georgia had great love for the Bible, committing many verses to memory. Often times she could be heard quietly quoting scriptures as they were read or referenced to from the pulpit. She loved to listen to Gospel music and

programming on the radio, especially when she was unable to attend church. She also enjoyed traveling and spending time with family and friends.

For a period of time Georgia was employed by the Mart as a Sales Associate. She worked as a Baker at Johns Hopkins University and also owned a small restaurant with her husband, Robert.

Her husband of fifty-nine years, Robert Hamlin Sr., son, Robert Hamlin Jr.; grandson, Dennis Hamlin; four sisters, Edna Grandison, Pauline Love, Alma Edwards and Ella Tynes; two brothers, Lloyd Grandison and Emmitt Grandison all preceded her in death.
