Gerry was a sharp dresser (Mr. GQ) and always took pride in his appearance. One of his favorite places to go dancing and socialize was the Vulcan Blazers. Gerry had the gift of gab and always spoke his mind. His motto, "They either love me or they don't".

He is survived by his wife Joyce, loving daughters, Danielle Katrina Moore and Martina Denise Pratt, who never left his side during his illness; sisters, Jerhretta Suite (Elmore) and Anna Moore; brothers Anthony (Jeanetta) and Martise (Melinda) Moore; and three grandchildren, Darius Antonio Heyward, Ima Paloma And Jade Alexandria Pratt; three special aunts, Thelma Baker, Janice Braithewaite and Jacqueline Diggs; a very special cousin, Raphael (Dinky) Baker, who is more like a brother, and a host of loving family and friends.
