If someone borrowed money, she loaned it, and always kept a record of it on a piece of "scratch" paper, which she kept in her Duster pocket (until they paid it back). Gertrude was humble and the "Little things in life made her happy. She had many special interests: Gertrude loved to buy fashionable "Faux" jewelry; especially earrings and she took pride in looking glamorous. She loved collecting recipes and cooking special dishes. She loved to socialize, and be the life of a party. Most recently, she enjoyed watching television (especially

Court TV and American Idol) and cable programming (Emeril Live, TBN, and BET (on Sunday mornings). Her favorite weekend activity was gathering the family together, cooking for them, and serving their favorite refreshments. But most of all, Gertrude loved studying God's word, listening to good Gospel music, especially the "old songs of her day." Gertrude was a long-standing active member of the Freedom Baptist Church. She supported and participated in church activities and served as a member on several auxiliaries. Gertrude loved the Lord and had a wonderful relationship with Jesus Christ.
