She was loving and compassionate aunt who stepped in to help raise four of her nephews after the death of her sister. Mrs. Duncan was a devoted Christian who loved God and her church. She joined Mt Pleasant Church soon after moving to Baltimore. She was in her attendance until her health began to fail.
