Gladys enjoyed her independence but realized she needed assistance as her illness progressed. She moved to her brother and sister-in-law's, Clifton and Doris Chambers, Assisted Living Home, where she received excellent care and an abundance of love. We will

miss our beloved sister and aunt. We will miss her wit, her spunk, her quick tonque and her laughter. We will miss sharing our good times and bad times. We will miss sharing the things with her that we would never share with anyone else. We will not be selfish and wish she was still with us because we know she is in a better place and she will always be in our hearts and thoughts.
