Gladys Cecilia Ann McFadden, affectionately known as "Annie", was born to the late William and Rosa Johnson on February 2, 1936 in Timmonsville, South Carolina. She departed this life on January 2, 2021 at Future Care in Baltimore, Maryland.

Gladys attended Timmonsville Public School System. Then on September 6, 1952 Gladys gave birth to Willie James Benjamin. Two years later Gladys married the love of her life, the late Deacon Frank McFadden, on October 11, 1954 in Florence, South Carolina. Frank and Gladys were married for 63 years.
