



## Gloria L Abraham

May 15, 1950 - December 5, 2024

Evangelist Gloria Louise Abraham affectionately known as "Weezie" was born to the late Leon Norris and late Virginia Pender in Baltimore, MD. My beloved mother and our sister in Christ departed this life on December 5, 2024. She received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System. Immediately after graduating high school, she started working at Rosewood State Hospital, at the age of 18, initially as a Direct Care Worker. Weezie dedicated 35 years of her life to working as a Direct Care Associate, a role she held until her retirement. Gloria was married to John Wesley Abraham, Jr. From this union was born one son, Anthony B. Abraham.

From her early years, and as the middle child of 12 siblings she learned the art of winning friends and influencing people, though occasionally she and her siblings posse engaged others in hand-to-hand combat to support and defend one another. Even in her youth, she was a natural leader, known for her ability to connect with others and her unwavering support for those she loved. Her short stature and fiery side was nothing compared to her tenacity, determination, and loyalty. Throughout her life, Gloria possessed an inquisitiveness and affinity for God that led her on a journey seeking understanding. In 1985, the intersection of time and place set the stage for the most transformative event of her life when she received the Holy Spirit and was Baptized in Jesus' name at Pentecostal Apostolic Faith Church in Baltimore, Maryland (now Solid Rock Apostolic Faith Church under the

leadership of Pastor Barbara A. Abraham). A devoted member of her church community, she actively served in various roles, including usher, nurse, Sunday School teacher, and evangelist. Loving personal engagement with people, she found her sweet spot in missionary work where he could serve others for Christ personally and compassionately.

Throughout her journey she faced many trials of her faith and grew in grace to become "...Steadfast, unmovable always abounding in the work of the Lord..." I Cor 15:58. She was a humble servant of the Most High God, a prayer warrior, and a worshiper clothed with a warm and loving spirit. Her pleasant demeanor and big heart remained a testament to the woman she was and the uncommon influence she wielded.
