Mrs. Gloria Gates Green departed this life on Thursday, January 1, 2004 at Brightwood Center in Lutherville, Maryland. A native of Brunswick County, Mrs. Green was born April 9, 1930 to the late R. Garfield and Estelle Gates. "Kitty," as she was affectionately known, was educated and graduated high school from Saint Paul's Polytechnical Institute. She continued at Saint Paul's for the following two years as an elementary education major. A connoisseur of higher education, she attended Cortez Peters Business School, administrative courses; Baltimore Community College, Inner Harbor Campus, Special Education; Coppin State College and Baltimore County General Hospital for medical terminology and related courses. Mrs. Green married Arthur B. Green in 1955 and relocated to Baltimore, Maryland. As a dedicated employee of Johns Hopkins Hospital, Mrs. Green retired after twenty-five years of service. She entered the education system and was a substitute teacher for four years. A civic leader, Mrs. Green received numerous awards, resolutions, citations, plaques and certificates of merit from various levels of the local government system.
