GWENDOLYN BEATRICE HALL was born in Staten Island, New York on October 13, 1932. She was raised in Winston Salem, North Carolina by her loving parents, Ralph and Delphine Morgan. The Morgans were the owners of the first Black transportation company in Winston Salem. They were both entrepreneurs and high achievers, which accounts, in part, for her innate and infectious passion for life and learning.

Because her parents wanted nothing but the best for her, she was enrolled in The Palmer Memorial Institute. Her years at Palmer were some of her most cherished. It was here at the exclusive Black boarding school, run by Dr. Charlotte Hawkins Brown, that Gwendolyn grew her wings. After Palmer, in 1950, she attended North Carolina College with a major in Business Education. In 1957, she married the love of her life, Lonnie B. Hall a.k.a. “the magician of football at North Carolina A&T University.”

In 1968, the loving couple moved to Baltimore, Maryland to take advantage of better opportunities for employment. Acclimating easily to their new home, Gwendolyn taught business education in the Baltimore City Public School System for over twenty-five years.

Gwendolyn and Lonnie had three beautiful children: Tina, Toni and Terry known as “The 3 T’s.” Her children were always her pride and joy. Gwendolyn wore motherhood like a glove.

Gwendolyn, a lifetime member of The New All Saints Catholic Church, had an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ that shaped and resonated throughout

her entire life.
