HAROLD LLEWELLYN DOBSON II started his earthly journey in 1952. He was gifted to the simply fantastic Mildred Turner Dobson and utterly incomparable Rev. Harold L. Dobson Sr. on November 17th and he joined the Ancestors on August 7th, 2021.

Harold's formal education began at the Fannie L. Coppin Experimental School #132 and continued through the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Baltimore City Public School #18, Garrison Jr. High, Northwestern High school where he played football as both a cornerback and quarterback and culminated at Howard University from which he graduated in 1974 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics.

Harold's adult employment history began with a stint as a Street Care Worker with the Baltimore City Recreation Department but his real job was that of community activist. Harold's involvement in community activism has its roots as a participant in the 1963 March On Washington and continued throughout his life as an advocate for the voiceless and often overlooked.

Harold can best be described as he has described himself: Son of God/ Man doing my very bestest to manifest the Most High's Kingdom on Earth as it is in Heaven. He was the Director of Development at the Holy Ghost Movement and Babalawo at Temple AFriKa, Baba Hurl.

As with most things concerning Harold, his marital and social interactions were complex and intricate and yet he was able to find peace, joy and happiness with his loving companion and kind friend Denise Mauricette.

Harold joins his parents, Rev. Harold L. Dobson, Sr. and Mildred Turner Dobson and brother, Dr. Eric Berkley Dobson in transitioning and leaves his sister, Spencella and brothers, Sherman, Jobert, John; sisters-in law, Jamilah and Sarah; beloved goddaughter, Angie Hite; stepmother, Pamela Jenkins Dobson; Uncle Irvin and Aunt Barbara; devoted companion, Denise Mauricette; and a host of loving cousins, nephews, nieces and friends to carry on in his wake.

“ *My sincere condolences to the Dobson family and significant others on the loss of Harold I called Harold over a month ago to touch bases and to see how he was doing but got no answer. So, I was really shocked yesterday when I heard he had passed, as well as his brother, Dr. Eric Dobson.*

Harold was a very bright, quiet and unassuming person who really cared about his family and friends, and would go the extra mile to visit sick and shut-in friends in nursing homes and hospitals, loan money, give a ride, rent rooms in his Forest Park home, and offer advice on read material. I will always remember and be grateful for his hospital visits to my late husband Wendell (whom he knew from Northwestern High School, First year in law school, and as a tenant) and especially for staying with Wendell in his hospital room for 3 hours while I ran errands. And, even though I told Harold to order whatever he wanted to eat from the menu and to put it on the hospital bill, he chose not to. Harold was good about sharing information he read as exemplified by him sending me weeks after Wendell's death an email about a meditation site to check out. I called to thank him for caring and reminded him that I was a practicing psychologist and aware of the benefits of meditation in coping with grief but would take a look at it to see if there was any new techniques.

May Harold rest in peace to know that all his pain and struggles are now over and now he can join his departed family and friends in the afterlife.
