Harry Mitchell Anderson son of the late Harry Smith Anderson and Christina J. Anderson was born July 19, 1927 in Baltimore, Maryland. Harry graduated into his new life with Jesus, and his family on October 12, 2016 following a lengthy battle with pneumonia.

Harry graduated from Douglass High School in Baltimore, Maryland. He had a great love of airplanes models as early as 10 years old. After High School he was drafted and gladly enlisted into the U.S. Air Force where he served under Benjamin O. Davis Jr., Base Commander and Chief for the Tuskegee Airmen his first two years in service. Under Commander Davis, Harry was proud to receive an honorable corporal rating. In addition, Harry was an aircraft mechanic and loved what he could bring into the Air Force. After his first term he attended air condition/refrigeration and electricity school. He didn't stop there and decided to also train in broiler making and oil burner gas heating. Harry didn't get enough so he re-enlisted into the Air Force. He served in the military for two terms.

After returning home he attended Polytechnic School on North Calvert Street to obtain an engineering license. After obtaining his license he worked for Maryland School for the Blind. His resume' also includes Baltimore Gas and Electric, Baltimore Transit Company as well as a part-time taxi cab driver.

Harry married Glenda Oliver, and out of that union their daughter, Lisa D. Anderson was born. She was his only child .

Harry loved to race his 1969 Rambler Rogue, re-build car engines to add speed, as well as love photography. He didn't own one Nikon camera. he owned three. Harry loved to teach his daughter to fly kited, and he loved to ride bicycles with her around the park. Most of all he loved to talk. Harry could talk for hours. He was like a fleeting bird who liked to talk strangers as well as people he knew.

He leaves to mourn: his daughter, Lisa Anderson; his friend and ex-wife, Glenda Anderson; the one man who was like a nephew to him, the Rev. Charles Bagley; and a host of others who became acquainted with him throughout his life.
