Harvey was affiliated with the American Legion. Shortly afterwards, Harvey went to work on the Railway System. Thereafter, Harvey gained employment with Philip Morris USA in 1969, where he retired in 1998 as a fixer, after almost 30 years of service. Harvey never met a stranger. He was good natured and enjoyed the outdoors. Even the wildlife enjoyed Harvey. Good with his hands, Harvey dabbled in art and horticulture. He had
