A Time to be Born: Hattie Ann Richardson Brown was born on July 6, 1924 in Halifax, Virginia as the fifth child of the late Classie and Riverside Richardson. Losing her mom at the age of ten on Oct. 24, 1934 impacted her steps in life. Hattie was reared by her only sister, Dora, and her aunt Claybell until she married.

A Time to Die: On Thursday, May 11, 2017, the angel came for her within minutes at Gilchrist Hospice Inpatient Facility and she quietly left for her new home with Jesus. During her last days and weeks she received lots of extra caregiving from her children, grandchildren, friends and especially her sons-in-law. Hattie exemplified the character traits of perseverance and determination in the areas of health, work and her faith. In her health journey, she received care from Season Hospice for thirty-one months; then fifteen months later with Gilchrist Hospice for 90 days.

Her legacy was "to never give up" and "trust in the Lord." Hattie was the last of her siblings to journey from this earth.

A Time to Plant: Hattie married Wallace Lee Jennings from Crewe, VA in 1941 and from this union came five children, Annette, Evonne, Spencer, Bernard and Marian. Later, she married Lewis Brown and from

this union a daughter Patricia was born. The support of her mother-in-law, Lucy Jennings and sister-in-law, Viola made an impact on her life and the life of her children.

A Time to be Employed: In Maryland she began shucking oysters as her first job. She later began working as a domestic worker. Hattie had a charismatic personality with people and became a successful salesperson for Watkins Product and later for Avon. She received various awards as an Avon salesperson and worked up until the age of 75.

A Time to Worship: Hattie was baptized at an early age. After she moved to Baltimore, she became a long time member of Mt. Pleasant Church where she worshipped with her cousin Marie and Clyde Womack for over 67 years. She was faithful in supporting her church her whole life. She took pride in cooking and selling dinners as fundraisers for the church. She was faithful in her tithes and contributions.
