Hattie B. Hill was born May 6, 1927, in Charlotte County, Virginia to the late Mary Francis and Herbert W. Scott. She entered life on April 24, 2014.

She graduated from Robert Moton High School in Prince Edward County, Virginia. She moved to Richmond, Virginia in 1946 and met her soul mate Billy Hill. They were blessed with two daughters. She retired from National Linen as a shipping clerk after 35 years of service.

She started attending Trinity Baptist Church in 1946 and joined in November 1964, under the pastorate of the late Rev. W. D. Adkins. Here at Trinity, Sister Hattie Hill was a very dedicated, faithful and loyal member of our church family. She was the Director of our Soup Kitchen Ministry for many years, where she loved serving those who were less fortunate. She served on the Sarah C. Turner Memorial Missionary Ministry, where she carried out the mandate of Jesus, "When I was hungry, you fed me, When I was Thirsty, you gave me water, and when I was naked, you gave me clothing." She was the secretary of the Missionary Ministry for over 30 years and the assistant secretary for the past four years. She served on the program committee for the Trinity Baptist Church Senior Fellowship Ministry. She also served on the Solid Gold Ministry. She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, East End Chapter #78 PHA.

On May 2, 2008, she received a plaque honoring her as a “Woman of Excellence” for the exceptional and invaluable influence she had on the lives of others.

Hattie was preceded in death by her husband, Billy M. Hill and seven siblings. She leaves to cherish her memory, two daughters, Alvina Burton (Tony) and Terry Hill; six grandchildren, Johnnie, Jr. (Charleen), Shontelle, Melvin (Renee), Tiffany, Tish, and Shanelle; twelve great grandchildren; devoted sister, Emma Edmonds; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, a devoted godson, Ralph Greene, and many many friends.
