



Havella Ethel Maith Mitchell

June 12, 1913 - September 26, 2001

On Wednesday afternoon God came down and picked a rose. Not just any rose but a special rose. On September 26, 201, Havella E. (Maith) Mitchell departed this life and went home to be with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Aunt Havie, as she was affectionately called, was born June 12, 1913, in North Thumberland County Virginia, to the late Henrietta and Robert Maith. She was the youngest of fifteen children. She received her education at North Tumberland County, Virginia Public Schools. Havella accepted the Lord at an early age. She was a member of Zion Baptist Church of Lottsburg, Virginia, where she was baptized under Rev. Sebrey. After coming to Baltimore, in 1929, Havella married the late Albert Dobyms. At the same time she joined Union Temple Baptist Church, on Pennsylvania and Cumberland, under the Rev. Grandville Simmons. Havella and some of the other members moved to their new location at 1100 West North Avenue, under the leadership of Rev. Charles Henry Churn. In 1948 she married the late Samuel H. Mitchell. Havella was Deaconess of Union Temple Baptist Church, and was a part of many organizations: The Zion Travelers, President of the Senior Choir, member of the Simmons Memorial Circle, sung on the Mass Choir, chairperson for Virginia Night, and one of the Mothers of the church. She would help out with many other ministries, wherever she was needed. She was an active, dedicated worker until her illness made it impossible. Aunt Havie loved to travel. She loved to dress. Always a fine dresser always wanted to be in charge. She also loved her church family. If there was

anything she could do or give her church family, they got it. Havella's memory will be cherished by her special niece Shirley Claiborne, her nephew, Purnell Maith and great-niece Laticia Claiborne, her six godchildren, Clarice Howard, Barbara Ann Mitchell-Washington, Gary Beingum, Carlos Williams, Havella McGee, Dawn Conley; two sisters-in-law, Evelyn Smalls, of South Carolina, Clara Maith, of Baltimore, Maryland; a host of other loving nieces and nephews, relatives and friends, including two devoted friends; Marion Peoples and Stella Johnson.
