Mother Hazel Fuller Charles, daughter of the late Rev. James H. Fuller and Lossie Mae Fuller was born on October 7, 1924 in Baltimore, Maryland. After the passing of her birth mother, Hazel and her siblings were raised by the late Hannah Fuller. Hazel departed this life peacefully on August 6, 2020 at 4:52 am in Future Care - Lochearn. Hazel who was affectionately called Granny by all at her grandchildren, received her education in the Green Spring Valley Public School System. At an early age, Hazel was married to the love of her life, the late Daniel Rufus Charles. This union was blessed with six sons and one daughter. Hazel joined Christian Memorial Church in 1954 with all of her children. Every Sunday she enjoyed the Holy Word of God as a pew member, until our founder, the late Rev. Lonnie Frank Brown preached about sitting on the seat of "Do Nothing". After that message, she joined the Gospel Chorus under the leadership of Mother Susie Sudderth. Later, she was asked by Sister Estelle Davis (another member, of the Gospel Chorus) to assist with the Wee and Junior Choir, where she later became the Director of the choir. After so many years of being a faithful servant to God and the church, Hazel was afforded the opportunity to be in charge of the Christian Memorial Multi-Purpose Building.

She loved serving the Lord and her community. Hazel was employed by the Naylor family as their personal chef and nanny for over 20 years; they developed an unshakable bond that could only be explained as her

extended family. A family isn't necessarily about blood relations, it's a group of people who love and trust each other and functions as a unit, and that's exactly how the Naylor's felt about Hazel, and how Hazel felt about the Naylor's. Hazel

also was a licensed caterer for over 20 years, she was known for her creative delicious meals and tempting desserts; in having her own catering business, she

was able to employ many people who were willing to work.
