



Hazel Bernice McIntyre

November 14, 1916 - February 12, 2013

Hazel McIntyre was a woman of three passions: her religion, her music and her husband. These three passions became the circle of her life.

Hazel Bernice, born on November 14, 1916 was the oldest daughter of Gertrude and Harold Frazier. She has one sister, Thelma Elizabeth and a brother, Charles Jerome. They were a close-knit family that often worked together. Her mother introduced her to her future husband, the late Bishop Thomas McIntyre; and Hazel married him at the age of twenty-one. Although their marriage was not blessed with children, there was much love and happiness in the forty-eight years they were married. Thomas McIntyre spent the years preaching the Word of God and Hazel was with him “making a joyful noise unto the Lord”.

By the time she was sixteen, she could play in any key and first played publicly at a mission located at Riggs and Carrollton Avenues. During the years that followed, she learned to play the electric guitar, the organ, and the saxophone by ear and in any key. She spent a total of sixty-three years playing for the Lord. Due to failing health in 1996, she was forced to give up her role with the church and the various choirs. Hazel was also a woman of strength — both physically and mentally. If you knew her well, I am sure she has challenged you to arm wrestle at least once. Her mental strength was exhibited most noticeably when she suffered a massive stroke in the early 70s. After she regained her ability

to walk and talk again, she went on to study music and for the first time in her life learned how to read the music that she loved so much. Her proudest musical moment was the concert she participated in playing one of the largest pipe organs in Baltimore City.

In April of 2003, she became a resident of Augsburg Lutheran Nursing Home where her sister also resided. She adjusted well and enjoyed visits with “her little sister” and in her early years, would occasionally play a hymn or two for the residents.

Hazel Bernice McIntyre was called to rest on February 12, 2013 at the age of ninety-six
