Helen Lee Williams, daughter of the late Frederick D. Gilliam and Nannie Gilliam Simpson, was born February 14, 1930 in Baltimore, Maryland. She attended Dunbar Elementary and Dunbar Junior High School. During the early years of her life she accepted Christ and was baptized by the late Rev. Edmond D. Meade, becoming a dedicated member of the Mt. Sinai Church. During her Christian journey, she was an active member of the Sunday school, Willing Workers and Nurses Unit. Helen was married to the late Norman Hawkins and from that union one child was born, Larry Hawkins who preceded her in death. She later married the late Quincy A. Lee, and from that union there were six children. One preceded her in death, Rosalind Parker. She was very industrious and was employed as a Nurse's Aide at Johns Hopkins and Baltimore City Hospitals and later became an employee of the Baltimore City Public School System, Lake Clifton High School, where she retired after many years of service. Helen was a sincere and trusted friend who loved people. She joined Adah Chapter #10, Order of the Eastern Star in 1979. She was also a member of Electa Court #3, Royal and Exalted Degree of the Amaranth and Jerusalem Court #1, Heroines of Jericho. After retiring she moved in the Ellerslie senior building and served as President of the Golden Keys Club and enjoyed many activities with residents. She was always willing to help others anyway she could. Helen's life will be cherished by many. She leaves to cherish her memory: four sons and one daughter, Quincy, Eric, Kenneth, Joyce and Maurice; one adopted daughter, Myrtle Robinson; one

sister, Mamie Snead; (one brother, Joyce E.
