November 23, 1916 - February 20, 2010

HELEN VIRGINIA CARTER JACKSON was born on November 23, 1916 to the late Lester and Bertha Moore in Morganton, North Carolina on February 20, 2010 she quietly and peacefully transitioned from her physical life to eternal everlasting life. Helen received her early education in the public school system of Burke County, North Carolina. She married the late Lazarus Jackson, Sr., and God blessed this union with two sons and one daughter. The family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland and became one of the founding families of the Cherry Hill community. Helen's interest in the pursuit of knowledge led her to take real estate courses and to sell real estate for Goldseker Realty. She also took nursing classes at City Hospital in Baltimore, and later she enrolled cosmetology classes at Carver Vocational School. She held various positions in the medical field, working in the office of Dr. Jerry Luck and the pediatric department of Baltimore City Hospital. Her faith in and affection for people and the plight of the less fortunate often prompted her to bring home newborn babies from City Hospital who were in need of temporary foster care. Additionally, she transported patients to medical appointments as the first driver of the Cherry Hill Mini Bus. Helen was extremely committed to the Cherry Hill community and delighted in opening her home to her fellow residents, providing refreshments to the lifeguards and others, and offering rest to people while they awaited public transportation. Even as her health waned, she could be seen strolling through her beloved Cherry Hill on a daily basis. She was a member of the Cherry Hill Presbyterian Church for fifty-three

years. She took an active interest in politics, and worked diligently in Cherry Hill with members of the Democratic Club, including Madeline Murphy, Sarah Bundy, Gloria Turnquist, Sheppard Burgess, and Gwendolyn Johnson. She was actively involved in the Mayoral campaign of Phillip Goodman, and she took particular pride in the fact that she played a visible role in the political campaigns of William Donald Schaefer. Though small in stature, Helen was a strong-spirited, outspoken woman. She loved to dance, and often reminisced about participating in dance competitions in the Carolinas with her late husband. The essence of Helen Jackson is reflected in the love shown for her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and other family members. Her devoted grandson, Chandler, was her constant companion for his entire life. She spent an inordinate amount of time, especially on holidays with her grandson Tommy II, granddaughter Gwen and great-grandchildren Falisha, Jessica and Jordan.
