



Henry Jackson Hart

August 31, 1935 - April 27, 2012

Henry Jackson Hart, son of the late Marion and Fannie Hart, was born on August 31, 1935 in Clarendon, South Carolina, township of Manning, South Carolina. After a brief illness, he departed this life on April 27, 2012. Before departing this life, he received Jesus Christ as his Savior, placing his soul at rest. He was an active member of Pennsylvania Avenue A.M.E. Zion Church.

He was educated in the public schools of Manning, South Carolina and Baltimore City. After the death of his father, he and his mother moved to Baltimore, Maryland in the 1940's following the migration North of a number of aunts and uncles. He had a few odd jobs before getting his dream job in 1957 at Bethlehem Steel in Sparrows Point. His uncle, Cleveland Johnson took him to Bethlehem Steel for that job. Henry was so proud of getting this job, he told everyone that he was at the point, and he wore the hardhat everywhere. His badge number was 218. He rarely missed a day at work. Despite the riots of the '60s, the blizzards in the '70s and the other calamities, Henry would be up and going to the Point at 5:00 a.m. In 1997, Henry celebrated forty years of service at Bethlehem Steel.

As a young man, Henry was constantly out and about, visiting family members: aunts, uncles and cousins. He was often doing things for his family, taking them places, running errands and just helping out in any way he could. He wanted to help his mother, so in 1971 he and she purchased a home in

Northwest Baltimore.

In December of 1970, he joined the Most Worshipful Hiram Grand Lodge of Maryland. He rose to the status of Honorable Past Master, St. John Lodge No. 13, Hiram Grand Lodge.

He leaves to mourn his passing: two brothers, Harry and Cleveland Conyers; a sister-in-law, Alverta Conyers; one niece, Jennifer Conyers; longtime friends, Deloris Tidwell; and a host of other relatives and friends.
