### Legacy of Love

Henry Lee Singleton was born on September 26, 1954, in Deland, Florida to the late Ernestine and Samuel Singleton, Sr.

Henry was called home to be with the Lord on Monday, January 1, 2024, as he slept peacefully. Henry acknowledged Christ as his personal Lord and Savior at an early age and re-dedicated his life at the First African Baptist Church in Richmond, Virginia where he became a member. He served on the Usher Board and sung in the Men's Choir. Henry always displayed respect for his elders and taught the younger generation to lead by example. Henry was also known for his firmness and take-charge attitude.

He earned a high school diploma from Charlotte High School in Punta Gorda, Florida in 1972. Henry was in the local band and an exceptional athlete. Henry joined the United States Coast Guard in 1973 and served for 30 years of dedicated service. He was a natural born leader earning many awards which included 10 Good Conduct Awards, 3 Humanitarian Medals and 3 National Defense Medals. While in the military, Henry met the love of his life, Regina Johnson. They were married May 6, 2000, and remained united until the Lord called him home. Henry was a determined man and very thankful for the life he and Regina built together in Virginia.

In 2005, Henry earned his Associates degree from Hawaii Pacific University in Supervision Management. He furthered his education and earned a Bachelors degree at the University of Phoenix, majoring in Human Services Management. In 2008, he completed a successful internship at the Social Security Administration.

Henry was a member of numerous associations which included Retired Coast Guards Chief Association, Disability Veterans, American Legion Post 144, USA Softball National Association, Softball Nation and West End Little League Association. In the last 10 years of his life, he became a referee and umpire. Henry enjoyed teaching young coaches about the job which included softball, baseball, football, volleyball and basketball.

Henry had a passion for golfing and bowling. He also enjoyed fishing, football (Go Eagles, #1 Fan), traveling, reading his bible, landscaping his yard into tip-top shape and spending quality time with his grandchildren.

Henry was preceded in death by his mother-in-law, Mildred Williams, two sisters, Josephine Qualls and Marie Singleton and one brother Samuel Singleton, Jr.
