Deacon Henry W. Bond, Sr., fourth son and seventh child of the late John W. and Lottie H. Bond, was born on April 9, 1944 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life to be with his Lord and Savior after a lengthy illness, on Wednesday, October 24, 2007 at the Mercy Medical Center in Baltimore, MD. Henry was educated in the Baltimore City Public School system, graduating from Fairfield Elementary #154, Benjamin Franklin Jr. High and Southern High School. At an early age Henry decided to follow Christ as a member of the Ebenezer COGIC and later Bethel COGIC both under the late Elder James F. Parker. He became a faithful member of Emmanuel Ministries COGIC under the leadership of Pastor Joel H. Lyles, Jr. Dea. Bond was dedicated to service for God, his fellow man, and Emmanuel. He was there when Sunday school doors opened. He was there to help with the people from the shelter. He was there to usher in the Saints, and he made time to paint biblical murals on the wall.
