Herbert Bryant was born January 15, 1930 in Chicago, Illinois the son of the late Charles and Mary Bryant. He was the second of six children. He departed this life on Tuesday, September 5, 2006 at home with his family by his side. Herbert was raised in the Morgan Park Community of Chicago, where he was a member of Beth Eden Baptist Church. Herbert attended and graduated from Tilden Technical High School in Chicago. He continued his education by attending The University of Chicago Illinois. He was a member of the Social Club; The Royal Knights, an organization that instilled pride, respect and mentorship in young black men in the Morgan Park Community. Herbert later served in the U. S. Army where he served in combat during the Korean conflict and received an honorable discharge. Herbert had a passion for driving and fixing cars. He would gain employment as a conductor and a motorman on streetcars and later as a bus driver. During the early 1970's, he later obtained employment as an insurance agent, a job that would move him to Baltimore, Md., where he worked for Western & Southern Life Insurance as district manager and later worked as a Correctional Officer for Clifton T. Perkins, from which he later retired after serving seventeen years. Herbert then met Estelle Jones during the year of 1973 and joined in marriage in 1975. From this union was born a daughter Michelle Bryant, one the loves of his life. Herbert also had four stepchildren, Robert, Katherine, Rodney and James, that he leaves to mourn. He also leaves behind: three brothers, Clyde, Earl and Preston; one sister, Ernestine, three sisters-in-law, Mildred, Florence

and Sandra; one brother-in-law, George; two daughters-in-law; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
