Dr. Thelma Gray Smith, wife of 44 years, caregiver, high school sweetheart, and Central High School Graduating Class of 1970, would call him husband, father, friend, classmate, and “Herrrrbberrt”.

Damien Tyshaun Smith, Son, and his wife, Deesha Pritchett Smith, shared Herbert’s care during his illness, his love of sports especially in coaching basketball together and cheering for the Washington Redskins, his sense of humor, and technician in his business, In-House Communications. They greeted their dad with “Hey Man” and called him “Pops”.

Damiya Tyneil Smith, Granddaughter (daughter of Damien and the apple of

Herbert's eye) became Herbert's cooking partner as they baked cakes and prepared breakfasts, and as she became interested in sports. Damiya called him "Papa".
